Review of progress after the 2nd coordination meeting

On 16.01.2020 in Prilep the 3rd Coordination Meeting of the SMecoMP Team was held, to which it was given SMecoMP Project – Review of progress after the 2nd coordination meeting. Professor Sartzetakis, as Lead Partner coordinator provided a detailed account of all actions taken during the period from the second coordination meeting. He underlined that during the last period, after the Surveys, Current State and Best Practice Reports are prepared, Three EU Universities worked hard on preparation of Curricula in the framework of the Four Modules. In this moment all Curricula are in final version. He emphasised the role of Faculty of Economics - Prilep which contribute to the Topics and Curricula development. As it was agreed all training materials will be ready in English and translated in the national languages, face-to face trainings and pre-incubator program should be realized during April.

of the four training modules

The SMecoMP project was built on the premise that in all countries of the program area, small and mediumsized enterprises (SMEs) that dominate economic activity, face the following two common challenges: inadequate entrepreneurship education environmental and resource management knowledge and skills. The SMecoMP project's contribution in addressing these challenges is the development of a comprehensive framework of training curricula which include four tailor-made training modules that combine the oretical knowledge the resource environmental regional and global problems with practical tools on how business can change their behavior in order to take into account these problems. The theoretical information and practical tools contained in the training modules are focusing on ecoinnovation and eco-entrepreneurial knowledge and skills required by SMEs staff.



Four training modules

TM1. Environmental and Energy Economics - Cost Benefit Analysis - Environmental Finance and Accounting.

TM2. Environmental
Management - Environmental
Impact Assessment - Corporate
Social Responsibility.

TM3. Eco-innovation and technology transfer.

TM4. From a green idea to a sustainable business.

In preparing for the curricula development, the SmecoMP partnership has conducted an extensive set of surveys in all four participating countries (Greece, Cyprus, North Macedonia and Bulgaria) in order to get businesses' opinion on knowledge and skills that SMEs require and on formal and non-formal educational training processes. The data collected have been analyzed and presented in a Current State and Best Practices Report produced in each country that also presents a review of relevant literature and case studies. The final version of the Current State and Best Practices Report that combines all relevant information from all four countries has been published in the project's electronic site and is available at: https://www.smecomp.eu/studies-publications. Based on these data four topics were selected and a preliminary short description of them was made available. These short descriptions received comments and suggestions from experts and stakeholders and were extensively discussed in the laboratories organized in all four countries receiving further valuable input.

Upcoming activities





The next activities in the project are **Face to face trainings** that will be provided by experts/trainers from academia and from business sector. Previously mentioned Modules will be the topics during classes.

There will be two trainings:

- one for group of 15 students (5 days, 3 hours per day) and
- one for 15 SMEs professionals and young entrepreneurs (7days, 3 hours per day).
